GENDER & SEXUAL SCIENCE: WHAT WE HAVE LEARNED IN THE 50 YEARS SINCE THE KINSEY REPORTS

Fifty years ago, *Sexual Behavior in the Human Female* (Kinsey, Pomeroy, Martin, & Gebhard, 1953) challenged traditional views of women's sexuality. Five years earlier, *Sexual Behavior in the Human Male* (Kinsey, Pomeroy, & Martin, 1948) revealed "shocking" details about men's sexuality. What have we learned about women's and men's sexuality since those landmark volumes? How do we currently understand the relationships between concepts of gender, sexual identity and sexual behaviors? How has the development of the sex research field and other factors such as the "sexual revolution," the civil rights movement, women's and gay rights movements, AIDS, and the internet affected expression of sexuality and gender? How did the work of the Kinsey team and Masters and Johnson pave the way for sex research and new understanding of sexuality and gendered relations. Presentations at this meeting will broadly address the topics of gender, sexuality, and sexual science and other current topics.

MEETING SITE — SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS

ACCOMODATIONS: Marriott Riverwalk Hotel

The Marriott Riverwalk is located in downtown San Antonio on the beautiful and historic River Walk and just blocks from the historic Alamo. The hotel is also located directly across the street from the Rivercenter Mall which features over 130 shops and an IMAX theatre. The hotel has 512 guest rooms, 260 of the rooms overlook the Riverwalk and have balconies.

Guest amenities include: two telephones with voice messaging, STSN high speed internet access, in-room movies, coffee makers, full size ironing boards and hair dryers. The hotel has a full service health club, which is available to guests 24 hours a day with room key access.
