In Memoriam: Dell Williams

After being humiliated by a department-store clerk when she tried to buy a vibrator in 1974, Dell was moved to start Eve's Garden, the New York boutique widely described as the nation's first sex shop catering specifically to women. Dell died this past March at her home in Manhattan; she was 92.

When Dell founded Eve's Garden at her kitchen table, discussions of female sexuality in general, and female orgasm in particular, had long been taboo. The only sex shops were owned by, and catered to, men. Today, thanks partly to Ms. Williams's work, the women's sex-product industry is a multimillion-dollar concern nationwide.

Ms. Williams was for four decades a nationally known advocate of women's liberation, sexuality and sexual health - a stance founded on the premise, as she often put it, that "women have a right to sexual expression."

Dell is fondly remembered as a regular at SSSS meetings and a pioneer.

Cynthia A. Graham, JSR Editor: WHAT'S NEW WITH JSR?

Here are a few updates, for your reading pleasure:

- Last year publication of the journal was increased to 9 issues (up from 8 issues). All 9 issues have been published (Volume 52, issues 1-9). All of the issues were published on time or ahead of schedule.
- For 2016, the publishers have increased the page count to 1,224 pages (up from 1,080 pages), which is 136 pages per issue.
- There are currently 5 Associate
 Editors (Dennis Fortenberry,
 Osmo Kontula, Zoe Peterson,
 Margaret Rosario, and John
 Wincze). Additionally, Sari van
 Anders began a 5-year term as
 ARSR Editor in January 1, 2015. I
 would like to thank the Associate
 Editors for their continued
 commitment and hard work,
 particularly as the number of
 submissions has continued to

increase.

- There are currently 42 Consulting Editors on the Editorial Board. In 2015 eight new Consulting Editors joined the Board: Aaron Devor (University of Victoria, Canada); Gert Martin Hald (University of Copenhagen, Denmark); Anthony Bogaert (Brock University, Canada); Robyn Shepardson (VA Center for Integrated Healthcare, USA); Theo Sandfort (Columbia University, USA); L. Monique Ward (University of Michigan, USA); Miriam Forbes (University of Minnesota, USA); Kirstin Mitchell (University of Glasgow, Scotland). - Two Consulting Editors retired from the board in 2015: Clive Davis and Marta Meana. Clive was involved with the journal for 38 years and was Editor-in-Chief of JSR from 1977 until 1987. Marta served as a Consulting Editor since

2009. We thank them both for their hard work and commitment to the journal.

- Our overall accept ratio for manuscripts received in 2014 was 20.6% (compared with 17.5% in 2013).
- From January 1 to October 31, 2015, we received 377 new manuscripts and 288 revised manuscripts. The projected number of new manuscripts for 2015 is 453.
- The mean turnaround time (from submission to first decision letter)
 for the manuscripts submitted since

January 1, 2015 was 53.9 days (range 15-105 days).

- The 2014 impact factor for JSR was 2.695 (a slight decrease from 2013, when it was 2.730) and the 5-year impact factor was 3.103, an increase from last year when it was 2.855. This is the first time we have achieved a 5-year impact factor over 3.
- The journal was ranked 1st out of 95 journals in the Social Sciences, Interdisciplinary category and 28th out of 119 journals classified as Psychology, Clinical.

Meet the Spring Student Research Grant Award Winner

Jody Ahlm is a Sociology PhD student at University of Illinois at Chicago. Her research interests include technology and sexuality, gender, bodies and embodiment, and queer theory. She teaches classes on sexualities, social inequalities, and gender. Her study "Hookup



Apps: New Technologies and Changing Sexualities" investigates the use of two hookup apps, Grindr for gay men and Tinder--marketed to heterosexuals but also used by non-heterosexuals. These apps are part of a growing trend of internet-mediated relationships and reflect the increasing normalization of casual sex, or "hooking up." The study will use in-depth interviews with app users and app executives, as well as media analysis of news articles and popular content about the apps to answer questions about the relationships between technology, sexuality, and social context.



The Bonnie and Vern L. Bullough Book Award

This Book Award is given annually by the Foundation for the Scientific Study of Sexuality (FSSS) for the most distinguished book written for the professional sexological community published during the previous year.

The book must be an original work, that is, not a new edition or an anthology from multiple authors. Its primary audience must be professionals working in the field of sexology, from any disciplinary perspective. To submit nominations, the author(s) or their publisher, or any individual acting with the author's consent should submit one copy of the



work, accompanied by a cover letter indicating that the book is being submitted for consideration for the award. An administrative nonrefundable fee of \$20 must be enclosed for each book nominated, check payable to FSSS.

In Memoriam: Candida Royalle

Candida Royalle (aka Candice Vandala), a former porn star who went on to become a pioneering female director in the adult film industry, died in her home of ovarian cancer on September 7th. She was 64.

Royalle was 30 when she shifted from starring in movies to producing and directing films for her own company, Femme Productions. She defined her work as female-oriented, sensuously explicit cinema.

She was a founder of Feminists for Free Expression, a sex-positive organization that opposes censorship and created a support group for actresses in erotic films who are exploited by their employers.

In 2012, when asked whether pornography still deserved a bad rap, Royalle said: "Perhaps if we weren't still so consumed with guilt and shame about sex, neither watching nor performing in these films would carry the weight it does, but then, perhaps we wouldn't be so interested in them, either. If the fruit were not forbidden, would anyone care to take a bite?"


Update from Your Student Involvement Co-Chairs!
